

Sending Your Child to School Situations and Responses

<u>Situation</u>	<u>Actions to be taken by parent</u>
Household member has COVID-19 symptoms.	Students are <i>required</i> to stay home for 10-14 days after they are last exposed to the sick person unless an alternative diagnosis is provided by a physician or a negative test result for the sick person is provided.
Household member tests positive for COVID-19.	Students are <i>required</i> to stay home for 14 days after they are last exposed to the sick person and immediate notification to school.
Student tests positive for COVID-19 by any type of test (PCR, rapid, at home, etc)	Students are <i>required</i> to stay home for 10 days and immediate notification to school.
Student has one of the symptoms listed on the daily certification of health.	Students are <i>required</i> to stay home for 10 days unless an alternate diagnosis by a physician or a negative PCR test result is provided.

STUDENTS WHO ARE QUARANTINED OR ISOLATED FOR 10 OR 14 DAYS MUST BE BROUGHT TO THE HEALTH OFFICE BY A PARENT ON THEIR FIRST DAY BACK TO SCHOOL.

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<u>Situation</u>	<u>Actions to be taken by parent</u>
Student or staff member is fully vaccinated and identified as a close contact to a positive COVID-19 case.	The close contact does not need to quarantine but should monitor for any signs/symptoms of COVID-19.
Student is identified as a close contact to a COVID-19 case based on classroom seating arrangement and is not fully vaccinated.	In the classroom, since all individuals are masked, close contacts will not need to quarantine for 10-14 days.
A student is identified as a close contact to a positive case due to their seating arrangement on the bus and is not fully vaccinated.	Even though students are required to wear masks on the bus, any close contact who is not fully vaccinated will need to quarantine for 10-14 days.
A student is identified as a close contact to a positive case due to their seating arrangement while eating lunch and is not fully vaccinated.	Students who are not fully vaccinated must quarantine for 10-14 days

10-day versus 14-day Quarantine

In order to end quarantine after 10 days (Day 0 is the last date of close contact), a student must take a PCR test on Day 8 or 9 and the negative result must be provided to the school's health office on the day of student return. If parents choose not to test their child, the time for quarantine is 14 days.

10-day Isolation due to COVID-19 Symptom on Certification Form

Isolation may end after a student receives a negative PCR test result or is seen by a physician and an alternative diagnosis is provided.

10-day Isolation due to Positive COVID-19 Case

There is no option to end this isolation period early, regardless of symptoms
